Paycheck deductions, also known as premiums, are the amount you pay for health plan coverage. Below is what you'll pay per bi-weekly paycheck deduction for medical, dental, and vision coverage.

MEDICAL PLANS

Beginning January 1, 2025, for your own medical coverage, the cost will be \$38.46 per paycheck before any wellbeing credits are applied.
